# WHO IS ON THE THRONE?

## SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focused on the vision of heaven as described in Revelation chapters 4 and 5, emphasizing the centrality of God's throne. The pastor highlighted the importance of recognizing Jesus as the one worthy to sit on the throne of our hearts, just as He is on the throne in heaven. The sermon also touched on the themes of worship, the worthiness of Jesus, and the ultimate redemption of creation. The pastor encouraged the congregation to reflect on whether Jesus is truly the Lord of their lives and to live in a way that honors Him.

- 1. God's throne is central to heaven and symbolizes His ultimate authority.
- 2. Jesus is the only one worthy to open the scroll and redeem creation.
- 3. Worship is a response to God's worthiness and involves our whole being.
- 4. Our lives should reflect Jesus' lordship, not just in words but in actions.
- 5. The vision of heaven provides hope and assurance of God's ultimate plan.
