

SERMON TOPIC: Wise Men Still Seek Him

SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focused on the story of the wise men from the East who sought Jesus after his birth, as described in Matthew 2:1-12. The pastor emphasized that the wise men teach us that Jesus is for everyone, regardless of status or background. They traveled a great distance, guided by a star, to worship Jesus and present him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, symbolizing his kingship, priesthood, and sacrificial death. The sermon encouraged the congregation to seek Jesus with the same dedication, to worship him with joy, and to give him their best, as he is worthy of our wonder, worship, and wealth.
