

THE SATANIC TRINITY

SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focused on the concept of the 'Satanic Trinity' as described in Revelation 13, highlighting the Antichrist and the False Prophet as counterfeits of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. The Antichrist is depicted as a world leader empowered by Satan, who will deceive many through false miracles and a counterfeit resurrection. The False Prophet will promote the Antichrist, leading a one-world religion and economy, and enforcing the mark of the beast. Despite the dark themes, the sermon emphasized that believers have nothing to fear if they know Jesus, as He has already secured victory over evil.

1. The Antichrist and False Prophet are counterfeits of Jesus and the Holy Spirit.
2. Satan's deceptions are powerful but ultimately limited by God's sovereignty.
3. Believers have nothing to fear if they are in Christ, as He has already won the victory.
4. Understanding end-time prophecies can strengthen our faith and resolve.
5. God's Word provides the wisdom and guidance needed to navigate spiritual challenges.
