SERMON TOPIC: God's Coming Kingdom

SERMON SUMMARY

This week's sermon focuses on God's Coming Kingdom and the millennial reign of Christ, as described in Revelation 20. Pastor Clark explains how the thousand-year reign will be a preview or 'trailer' of what eternity will be like in the new heaven and new earth. During this period, Satan will be bound, and Christ will rule from Jerusalem, bringing unprecedented peace, prosperity, and purity to Earth.

- 1. The millennium will be a time of unprecedented peace, prosperity, and purity on Earth
- 2. Believers will reign with Christ during this thousand-year period
- 3. Satan will be bound during the millennium but released for one final rebellion

 The final judgment will determine eternal destinies based on whether names are written in the Book of Life
- 5. Only through faith in Christ can we ensure our names are written in the Book of Life

- How does the promise of no more sickness or death in the millennium encourage you in your current struggles? Why do you think God allows Satan one final rebellion after the thousand years?
- · How should the reality of final judgment influence how we share the gospel with others?
